Aug 8 David Scott William Jackson John Reid & William Mashe above designed having been cited to this dyet & called compared and acknowledged their breach of the sabbath at Moffat well and they were rebuked before the sepsion and was exhorted to better behavouer for the future and dismissed

David Moffat weaver and woolcomer in Moffat having been cited to this dyet ³¹⁰ and called compared and Christian Grays Confession entered before this sepsion on the eighteen of July last having been read over to him and he exhorted by the Moderator to declare the truth he acknowledged that he was guilty with her in the terms of her Confession and signed the same in presence of the sepsion

He was suitably spoke to by the Moderator and was rebuked for his sin and exhorted to repentance

Sept 5th 1773 David Welsh in this parish and Margaret Welsh in the parish of Drumalver was proclaimed the third and last time being twice proclaimed this day in order to their Marriage

Sept 12 John Short Wright in Moffat and Catharine Proudfoot was proclaimed the third and last time

Sept 10 David and Margaret Welches was Married

Sept 17 John Short and Catharine Proudfoots was Married

Oct 27 this day the sepsion made choice of William Moffat one of their number to as parish Elder to attend the presbytree for the ensuing half year and the synod of Drumfries

Nov 7 1773 after prayer Sermon Dr John Walker Moderator and Clerk this day Margaret Proudfoot a single person late servant to James Duncaith in Moffat voluntarily compared before the sepsion and judicially acknowledged that she was with Child in fornication and being exhorted by the Moderator to
