John "Jack" C. Emery passed Saturday, Nov. 17, 2012. He was born to Helen Easton Emery and Alton Titus Emery in October 1921 in Paso Robles, Calif., delivered by Dr. Soby. For 60 plus years, Jack owned and operated the family beef cattle ranch in Indian Valley, San Miguel, Calif. He was a good steward of the land, a good cowboy, friend, and neighbor and a terrific storyteller. Jack was extremely proud of his service to his county during World War II. He was a supervisor at the Oakland Naval Shipyards prior to being drafted into the U.S. Army in 1944. He was stationed in the South Pacific, where he was a Heavy Equipment Operator in the Army Corp of Engineers. Jack is survived by his sister, Jean Emery (Steve); brother, Jayana Emery (Cathy); daughter, Jae Emery Eade (John); daughter-in-law, Andi Emery-Drayton (Steve and son, Spencer); granddaughters Jamii Eade Pura (Stan) and Ashley Emery McLaughlin (Kevin); grandsons Zac Dalton, John Dalton, John Eade Jr. (Sondra) and Alton Emery; stepchildren Kyle Righetti, Tom Mailheau (Renee) and Cassie Mailheau; and great-grandchildren Kayce, Shane, Trevor, Tre, Emery and Brett.
