

I S A B E L G R E Y P O W E R S

Born- Nov. 1847 at St. Louis, Missouri, daughter of Mr. John Gray and Elizabeth Wardrobe Gray-who came from Scotland in her early life, crossing the Atlantic in one of the old-time sailing vessels, and settling in St. Louis.

About 1857 the family moved to Salt Lake City, Utah. Then to Carson City, Nevada about 1863, where she met and married HENRY CLAY POWERS December 24th. 1867.

About 1870, ISABEL GREY POWERS and HENRY CLAY POWERS, returned to Covington, Nebr., where his relatives were. After three years in the livery business, they returned to Salt Lake City for two years. 1875 to Corinne, Utah, 1878 to Sublett. The family had grown to include three children.

ISABEL GREY POWERS became the Mother of 12 children, losing one child at birth and, ELIZABETH NEVADA POWERS at 6 years.

The family lived, farmed, raised sheep and cattle, and had a mercantile store and Post office in Sublett. During a marriage of 62 years, they raised 10 children.

Starting with a 160 Acre homestead, their holdings grew to include 2000 acres, several hundred head of cattle and sheep. Real estate in Burley and other places in Cassia County. ISABEL had two step-bro. (ROBERT & ANDREW WARDROBE) one step-sister. (MARY WARDROBE) and two bro. (ROBERT AND WILL GREY).

ISABEL GREY POWERS died at Vernonia, Oregon, Nov. 13th. 1941, at the age of 94.
