One-Day Drive Will Be Made to Put County Over Top in This Important Task—Allotment for the Districts Announced. Must Not Fail in This Loan, Most Important of All

ORIENT LOOKING TO UNITED STATES

General Recognition in Japan and China That Christian Ideals of This Country Must Solve Problems of Future in Those Great Nations. Message From Y Secretary

C. S. Bishop, a Y. M. C. A. leader, who has just returned from the Orient, startled a group of Riverside business men today when he said that some of the greatest political leaders in China have given up the highest position in the country to take up Y. M. C. A. work as the best means for serving their country in the present crisis. It was, he said, as if Geo. W. Perkins were to give up his business and President Wilson lay down the presidency to become Y. M. C. A. secretary in America.

Mr. Bishop was sent to Japan, China, Korea and the Philippines in the war crisis to interpret Christian ideals to the people of those lands. Mr. Bishop said that after spending some time in Japan he decided that the country was not tied to the past in banking, commerce or industry; the country, however, is still pagan and is handicapped by pagan ideals.
