Extract Decree
Margaret Williamson
against
John Waugh

At Linlithgow, the Ninth day of January Eighteen hundred and ninety one years. Sitting in Judgement, George Fisher Melville, Esquire, Advocate, Sheriff Substitute of the Lothians, in an action before the Sheriff Court of the Lothians and Peebles at Linlithgow, at the instance of Margaret Williamson, Domestic Servant, residing at One hundred and fifteen High Street, Linlithgow, in the County of Linlithgow, Pursuer against John Waugh, Miner, residing at Old Hill Row, Champfleurie, in the County of Linlithgow, Defender the said Sheriff Substitute in absence of the defender, Decerned and Ordained and hereby Decerns and Ordains the said defender to make payment to the said pursuer of (first) the sum of Two pounds two shillings Sterling as upon the twenty seventh day of November Eighteen hundred and ninety, said sum being the inlying expenses incurred in connection with the birth of an illegitimate female child of which pursuer was delivered on said 27th November 1890, and of which child defender was the father: (Second) the sum of Seven pounds sixteen shillings Sterling per annum as the aliment of said child, for the period of twelve years from and after said 27th November 1890, said sum of Seven pounds sixteen shillings per annum to be paid quarterly and in advance, beginning the first quarterly payment thereof as upon said 27th November 1890, and so on quarterly and in advance thereafter for the said period of twelve years: Item, of interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum on said sums as they have fallen or may hereafter fall due till payment: And Decerns and Ordained and hereby Decerns and Ordains the said Defender to make payment to Peter Miller Junior, Solicitor, Linlithgow, the Agent Disburser thereof, of the sum of Five pounds nine shillings and two pence of taxed expenses of process, with the sum of Three shillings further as the expense of extracting this Decree and of recording the same.
