- **Current frequencies:** GB 2254, Ireland 127
- **GB frequency 1881:** 1463
- **Main GB location 1881:** Midlothian and Lanarks; also Durham and Northumb
- **Main Irish location 1847–64:** Down; Derry and Tyrone

1 Scottish, English: (i) locative name primarily from Fairlie (Ayr), but perhaps occasionally from other places similarly named, such as Fairley (Northumb), Fairlee in Newport (IoW), and Fairliehope (Linton, Peebles). (ii) see FARLEY.

Further information

A Scots family once known as *de Ros* adopted the name *Fairlie* when granted lands at Fairlie (Ayr) by Robert the Bruce.

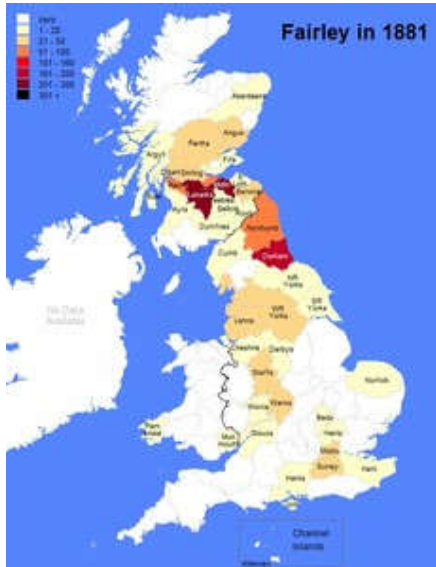
