HEDGE STREET	2.6.17	11 pm	An Infantry bombing party started from G Sep. but was beaten back by a barrage of shrapnel and suffered casualties. 1 NCO & 2 of our sappers were to have followed the raiders over and destroyed enemy TMs. had the Raid succeeded. SDR		
MOUNT SORREL	2.6.17	3 am	An enemy party, about 30 strong, approached our lines and threw some bombs, but on our men retaliating they withdrew. Ypres. 2.6.17. 1 OR killed. SDR		
ZILLEBEKE ROAD	3.6.17		One OR killed. 7 OR wounded, one OR gassed. 4.6.17. Two OR died of wounds. Ypres. 6.6.17. 1 OR wounded. SDR		
TOR TOPP	7.6.17		8 Officers and half a section of our sappers were told off on 5 <sup>th</sup> inst. for duty at each of these SDR		
MT. SORREL			Underground Systems. At 3.10 am. the British bombardment and attack began. At Mount Sorrel several of our men followed the Infantry and took possession of the underground German workings: (about 1200 ft of galleries were found): meanwhile others connected the British & German underground systems by driving a short gallery from Sudbury Listening Post; this connection was made by midday and was immediately used to bring up Infantry reinforcements. By 7.30 am. our sappers had excavated and completed an Artillery O.P. at 281.30d.1.7. and by 7.30 pm a battered German dug-out had been fixed up as a Battalion Forward Command Station at 281.30c.6.6. SDR.
